Dear Sir

By Leut. Ross you will receive news that will call to action every sympathy of your Lord the Flower of Kentucky at the head of the left wing of the N. W Army is no more, he will tell you more than I could write. I have received orders to march to Fort Winchester with three of the remaining Companies of my Regiment. You I expect will also receive orders to march to the same point. I would suggest to you the propriety of Transporting your Baggage by Water and if you think it practible drop down as may empty Canoes as will take over the loading that is in the Sledges between your post and this The loading Can get on no how else and will be of great advantage to Army. I wish you to immediatly on the receipt of this to dispatch an express to me how and when your Troops will start to this place and if shortly I will remain here and we will march together I wish to hear from you as quick as possible
